Transformation Update - Adult Learning

Training teams in their current forms will change. The plan will be to have District Volunteering Teams who will be responsible for the following:

- Attracting and welcoming new volunteers
- Making sure volunteers are well supported
- Support volunteer learning
- Recognising volunteers

As part of supporting volunteers with their learning District Volunteering teams will:

- help volunteers and Young Leaders find and engage in learning and development opportunities
- coordinate learning that needs to be delivered by a trainer, including external organisations where relevant
- use learning delivery materials and adjust these where needed to ensure activities are accessible to all
- help volunteers share best practice and overcome challenges
- recognise prior learning and experience

Transformation Update - Adult Leanring

Making learning more valuable and convenient
The plan is for volunteers to have greater control of what
and when they complete their learning.

There will be an increase in the digital delivery of learning however this will not mean that face to face sessions are no longer available. All learning content will work well on desktop computers, laptops, tablets and smartphones

With Transformation there will be a move to an optional Wood Badge. Every volunteer will be able to decide what learning will be most beneficial to them to earn their Wood Badge and whether they want to do a Wood badge at all

Composition of learning

Learning will consist of two levels:

1. Growing Roots – required for all appointments

Growing Roots will replace 'Getting Started' and will require to be completed within the first six months of a new volunteer starting their appointment. This training will provide everything a volunteer needs to start delivering a safe, challenging, structured and exciting programme.

The training will be split into the following:

- a. The learning which a volunteer needs to know: data protection, safe scouting (safety, safeguarding, risk assessments), creating inclusion and what volunteers need to know and how to do it
- b. The learning a volunteer needs for their team and role ie working with people (parents, other adults, young leaders), delivering a great programme, being a trustee and leading scout volunteers

2. Branching Out

This will form the learning beyond Growing Roots. the learning will be delivered through a variety of methods including digital, face-to-face and blended models. Some current modules will keep running for a while as they are in the process of being updated or replaced

Branching Out will encompass a variety of learning options such as digital skills, permits and adventurous activities, practical scouting skills and team leadership for example

Manager and Supporter Training

This is being reviewed over the next 18-24 months with the updated learning being released during 2025. The current training courses are being updated with information re transformation and squirrels

What Next

- 1. Individuals, line managers, training support and training delivery should continue until the date of the transformation
- 2. Section Leader training will continue to be delivered for the following modules 8, 9, 11, 13, 16, 18, 19 for the next 18-24 months due to the replacements not being ready until 2025. Module 17: Running safe activities is under review
- 3. There is a need to ensure that each member has an unique EMail address that they use for Scouting. The new Membership system runs on a single EMail address per use. Where this is not unique, records are unable to be stored
- 4. Adults who have completed learning for modules (5 onwards) should have them validated prior to transformation change over (provisionally 1 Feb 24), otherwise the learning will be lost and not transferred over
- 5. If the Getting Started modules are not completed by the date of the transformation then the Leader will be required to start the Growing Routes process and complete additional learning.
